

**“S” Corporation Employers
Issues Affecting Your 2% or More Shareholder-Employees for 2022**

An “S” corporation’s cost of health or long-term care insurance premiums paid on behalf of its 2% or more shareholder-employees is treated as Form W-2 taxable income to the 2% or more shareholder-employees (Note - it’s tax-deductible as compensation to the “S” corporation). Recent IRS announcements require that the “S” corporation either directly pay the insurance premiums or reimburse the shareholder-employee for personally paid premiums, in order to save income taxes by deducting the health insurance premiums. The insurance amounts will be “W-2 reported” as wages subject to income tax but not subject to FICA/Medicare taxes.

If your Company provided health or long-term care insurance coverage to employees who also owned 2% or more of your stock in 2022, please complete the following information and submit it to us as soon as possible for payroll processing:

Important Note - Please provide us this information by December 2 or a minimum of two weeks prior to your last check date of the year, so we can prepare accurate shareholder-employee W-2 forms. *Additional fees will be applied if information is provided after 12/16/2022.**

ADVISORY NOTE: Make sure all 2022 health insurance premiums (including Medicare premiums paid from social security benefits) are paid/reimbursed by 12/31/22.
