

**Employer Retirement Plan Information  
For Calendar Year 2022  
Planning For 2023 Funding By Employees**

Form W-2 requires that we check certain boxes to identify which of your employees were “active participants” in retirement plans during 2022. “Active participation” implies that an employee received an economic benefit (contributions, plan allocations, etc.) from a retirement plan during 2022. **Accurate presentation of this information is important since it affects your employees’ eligibility for tax-deductible IRA’s on their 2022 personal income tax returns. Review your 2022 W-2 Verification Report to see if employees are classified correctly and notify AccuPay of any changes.**

**Please check all of the following types of retirement plans you sponsored during 2022 which included employer contributions for the benefit of employees:**

- Defined benefit or cash balance pension plan with calculations made by an actuary;
- SEP-IRA plan;
- Profit-Sharing plan;
- Money Purchase Pension Plan;
- SIMPLE plan which involved employer contributions;
- SARSEP plan which involved employer contributions;
- 401(K) plan which involved employer contributions;
- 403(b) plan which involved employer contributions.

**NOTE - Provide us a listing of all employees for whom your company made 2022 employer contributions or who otherwise benefited from a retirement plan during 2022 (i.e., perhaps their only benefit was an allocation of 2022 retirement plan income). We will check boxes for only those employees who “actively participated” in retirement plans during 2022.**
